



Tuition Cap

What is the Tuition Cap?

During the 2023 legislative session, as part of the biennial state budget for fiscal years 2024 and 2025, the General Assembly passed a cap on the per-student tuition amounts magnet school and vocational-agricultural (Vo-Ag) program operators may charge local or regional school districts that send students to attend these school choice options. In 2024, the legislature extended the cap for all future fiscal years.

Beginning in FY 2025, the per-student tuition amount an operator may charge is capped at 58% of the per-student tuition amount the operator charged in FY 2024. As a result of this cap, sending districts paying tuition will experience savings due to lower tuition costs.
